



**Angela Phillips Diaz**, Executive Director of Government Research Relations at the University of California San Diego (UCSD), works with both Chancellor Pradeep K. Khosla and Vice Chancellor for Research Sandra A. Brown to ensure that the benefits, promise, and needs of UCSD's research enterprise are effectively communicated in the agencies, departments, offices, and organizations in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area.

Diaz initiates and arranges interactions between university leaders and elected and appointed officials in the nation's capital and elsewhere, and she monitors and influences those legislative and agency developments that will or could affect UCSD.

Diaz is the President and CEO of Phillips Diaz & Associates, a consulting practice that focuses on strategic planning, science and technology research and education, and organizational development. Through her consulting, Angela served a number of non-profit clients, including the California Council on Science and Technology (CCST) and the Virginia Academy of Science, Engineering, and Medicine (VASEM), providing strategic communications, policy guidance, and development support.

Diaz has held executive leadership positions in education, government relations, legislative affairs, aerospace and international relations at NASA, the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy, the University of California Riverside, and Purdue University. She has extensive experience in science and engineering education, science and technology policy, and has worked with various public and private start-up organizations and initiatives. She has worked with organizations ranging from Fortune 500 companies to startups, non-profit organizations, and government agencies in North America, Europe, Asia, and Australia.

In addition, Diaz has served on multiple international, national and regional non-profit boards of directors. Her community work has included serving on the Marymount University Board of Trustees, chairing the ARCS Foundation Science and Engineering Advisory Council, and serving on the Space Education Outreach Committee of the International Astronautical Federation, Women in Aerospace Foundation, the AIAA Policy Committee, and the Marymount University Board of Visitors. In 2012, Diaz accepted an adjunct faculty position in Purdue University's College of Technology.

Diaz holds an MBA in management and finance from Marymount University of Virginia, and she is an alumna of the Harvard University Kennedy School of Government Senior Executive Program and the Harvard Business School Advanced Management Program. Her honors include the Virginia Foundation for Independent Colleges Distinguished Alumni Award, the NASA Outstanding Leadership Medal, the Marymount University Alumni Achievement Award, Meritorious Presidential Rank Award, and the Women In Aerospace Outstanding Member Award.
