



**M. Susan Smith** is currently Professor Emeritus at the Oregon Health & Science University (OHSU). She served as the Director of the Oregon National Primate Research Center at OHSU from 1994-2007. During that time, she oversaw the research programs of the Center as well as the research facilities located on over 150 acres of land. The Oregon Primate Center is one of seven national primate centers that are supported by the National Institutes of Health. From 1997-1999, she also served as Founding Director of the Center for Women's Health at OHSU. She continues to provide leadership at OHSU as Chair of the Medical Research Foundation of Oregon Research and Education Committee, as a member of the OHSU Foundation

Board and of the Leadership Council for the Center for Women's Health.

Dr. Smith's research program has been funded by the National Institutes of Health since 1975; her research focus is on brain regulation of food intake and energy balance and on reproductive function. She has over 160 publications in national and international journals. She has served on the editorial boards of numerous professional journals, including *Biology of Reproduction*, *Current Opinion in Endocrinology & Diabetes*, *Endocrinology*, *Frontiers of Neuroendocrinology*, and *Neuroendocrinology*. She has served on study sections at the National Institutes of Health, as well as on committees for the National Institute of Child Health and Development. She has also served in leadership roles in various professional organizations, including the Board of Directors of the Society for the Study of Reproduction, Research Advisory Committee of the Federation of American Societies in Experimental Biology, The Finance and Audits Committees of the Society for Neuroscience, the Endocrine Council of The Endocrine Society, President of The Endocrine Society, and Board of Directors of The Hormone Foundation. She is the recipient of the Sidney H. Ingbar Distinguished Service Award of the Endocrine Society, the Virenda B. Mahesh Lecture Award in Physiology at the Medical College of Georgia, and the Mentor Award of the Medical Research Foundation of Oregon. She also received a Presidential Commission to serve on The Presidential Committee for the National Medal of Science from 2003-2005.

Dr. Smith received her PhD in Physiology from the University of Georgia and was a postdoctoral fellow at Emory University. She was an assistant professor at the University of Massachusetts Medical Center and an associate and full professor at the University of Pittsburgh before moving to Oregon.
